



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### What's In 2026 Operating Budget





**Gross Operating Budget (before revenue sources are removed)** 

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Court Security & Prisoner Transportation (CSPT) \$1,802,410

Community Safety Policing (CSP) \$982,460

**Combined = \$2,784,870 (43.3% of total revenues)** 

#### **Grant Uncertainty**

- Renewal not guaranteed
- 2026 allocations may be below 2025 level
- Confirmations arrive late, creating in-year volatility

#### **Program Exposure**

CSPT funds approximately 60% of Court Security and Prisoner Transportation program costs; however, *CSPA* requires POJ to bear 100% of the responsibility.

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# 2026 Financial Impacts Inflation and Supply Volatility



Higher-than-estimated supplies & equipment costs Price influenced by external factors

- Currency
- Commodities
- Global supply chains
- Vendor consolidation
- Regulatory/standard changes

#### **Pressure Points**

- Vehicle parts and upfitting
- Protective gear & uniforms
- Ammunition
- IT/Software licensing
- Radio infrastructure components

#### **Effects**

Upward base pressure, longer lead times, larger contingencies required

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





#### 2024 Policing Cost Comparison of Single Tier Municipalities Cost Per Capita Basis









#### Count of Calls by Area











#### Count of Calls by Generated Type




#### Count of Calls by Area


#### Count of Calls by Occurrence Type






