


The governing legislation for Police Services Boards and Police Services as to how policing is provided in Ontario.

Comprehensive Ontario Police Services Act





Core Functions of Policing

Police Services must include, at a minimum:

1. Crime Prevention

2. Law Enforcement

3. Assistance for Victims of Crime


4. Public Order Maintenance



Section 4(1)

Every municipality shall provide adequate and effective police services in accordance with its needs





Section 3
The municipality is responsible for providing all infrastructure and administration necessary for providing such services.

Including:

- Vehicles / Boats
- Equipment / Supplies
- Communication Devices
- Building

POLICE SERVICES BOARD Governance

- The Board and the Service are distinct entities, but both are created by the Police Services Act
- Code of Conduct for Board members under O.Reg 421/97
- Board cannot interfere with operations
- Board cannot direct any Member of the Service except Chief



POLICE SERVICES BOARD



Five Member Board

- Two Members of Council (Mayor + 1 Councillor)
- Two Provincial Appointees
- One City Council Appointed Community Member

The Board is not a department of City Hall and is autonomous from City Council or staff at City Hall





POLICE SERVICES BOARD

Responsibilities

- Ensure the Service is adequate and effective
- Determine objectives and priorities in consultation with Chief
- Recruit and appoint the Chief and Deputy
- Approve the budget for presentation to council
- Negotiate collective agreements with Associations






Peterborough Police is a generalist police service










Peterborough Police has policing contracts with:





YOUR ROLE AS COUNCIL



- Approve overall budget
 - Councillors do not have the authority to approve or not approve specific line items in the police service budget



YOUR ROLE AS COUNCIL



- Adhere to Police Services Act requirements to:
 - Provide adequate and effective policing
 - Provide infrastructure and administration to meet the requirement for adequate and effective policing



YOUR ROLE AS COUNCIL



 Members of Council, whether on the Police Services Board or not, cannot direct any member of the police service, including the Chief or designate



YOUR ROLE AS COUNCIL Complaint Process



 There is a formal process for residents and council to file reports

• This process ensures the proper recording of an incident happens and that appropriate follow-up occurs
