## A Budget torn between past, present and future

- 4% increase in 2023; however, worth noting that between 2015 and 2021 increases were less than 3%.
- This is having an impact currently as it limited the Service's ability to grow with the community. And we know that the community is growing.
- Fixed costs in policing that limit what the Service can control staffing costs, fuel costs, inflation etc.
- Legislative requirements e.g. the Comprehensive Ontario Police Services Act, recommendations from Coroner's Inquests



#### How the community feels\*

- 67% of survey respondents in the City perceive that crime has increased in their community
- 50% of survey respondents in the City would recommend their community as a good place to live
- 48% of survey respondents in the City feel safe or very safe in their community
- "Peterborough Police is understaffed and under-resourced making it difficult to take a proactive approach to policing"

#### How the community feels\*


- 86% of survey respondents in the City state that policing is very important or important




Communications staff answered 165,319 calls in 2022.





The busiest time for calls is approximately 7am - 12midnight.





#### 2022 Workload Distribution


Count of Calls Where an Officer was Dispatched by Area





#### Workload in 2022 – Total Calls by Dispatch Type










#### Violent Crime Severity Index 2018 - 2022






#### Non-Violent Crime Severity Index 2018 - 2022






#### Peterborough has more criminal cases per officer







#### Recruitment Timeline

#### Ontario Police College (OPC)\*

- Currently 3 intakes per year (January, May, September)
- In 2024 moving to 4 intakes (starting in Dec 2023)
- Limited seat allocation



January 2023 May 2024 May 2027

Over that time expect: Municipal growth, increase in complexity of cases, potentially more officers unable to be deployed, increase in calls for service, legislative changes, public expectations, resignations, retirements



## Police Net Budget as % of City Budget





#### What should we stop doing?



- Stop criminal record checks
   (IMPACT = repurpose civilian members)
- Stop dedicated traffic enforcement
   (IMPACT = reduced city revenue from PONs, traffic is community priority, repurpose four officers)
- Stop Community Services / School Liaison Officers
   (IMPACT = reduced crime prevention, reduced youth engagement, reduced responses. All other jurisdictions that have done this have seen an increase in youth/school-related violence)
- Stop non-core-related responses focus on crime response do not respond to "community service", "suspicious person" "assist citizen", unless there is a criminal component

#### What should we stop doing?



 Reduce proactive investigations into areas such as Human Trafficking, Hate Crime, Drug Investigations

(IMPACT = creates a reactive response to these issues)

- Reduce gas consumption respond from the station like other first responders
   (IMPACT = reduced visibility and crime prevention benefits; increased response times)
- Extend life of vehicles

(IMPACT = increased maintenance costs, postpones costs e.g. prisoner transport van)
