


Established in 1850, celebrating 175 years in 2025

These areas are divided into six policing patrol zones.



# Peterborough, Lakefield & Cavan Monaghan(All Areas)

#### **Crime Severity Index (CSI)**

#### **Overall CSI (Violent & Non-Violent)**

Peterborough is **21**<sup>st</sup> out of the 43 Ontario municipal police services. Overall CSL **5.07%** over 2022.

#### **Violent CSI**

Peterborough is **15**<sup>th</sup> out of the 43 Ontario municipal police services. Violent CSI ha **1%** over 2022.

#### Non-Violent CSI

Peterborough is **23<sup>rd</sup>** out of the 43 Ontario municipal police services. Non-Violent CSI ha **7.37%** over 2022.

Peterborough Police Service (All Areas)

40,606 Occurrences (Jan 1 – Dec 31/24) 10%

7,795 of these occurrences were criminal in nature = 19.2%

4,639 criminal occurrences = 131%

3,569 arrests = 26%

### 9,161 Occurrences (Jan 1 – Dec 31/24) 18%

1,640 of these occurrences were criminal in nature = 18%

### When to call 9-1-1



- Call 9-1-1 if it is an emergency and you require police, fire or ambulance for a crime in progress
- Your life or someone else's is in danger (e.g., assault, motor vehicle collision, impaired driver, active fire)
- You or someone else is having a medical episode




### 9-1-1 Statistics



From January 1<sup>st</sup> to December 31<sup>st</sup>, 2024

- 9-1-1 calls 42,637 have been answered (average of more than 116/day)
- Hang-up calls 7,047\*

### When to call the general (non-emergency) line



Call **705-876-1122 X225** 

To report an incident that is not immediate in nature.

E.g., A property crime you have just discovered but is not in progress



# Non-Emergency Call Statistics



- From January 1<sup>st</sup> to December 31<sup>st</sup>, 2024, Peterborough Police Service Communicators answered **119,769** non-emergency phone calls. These are separate and apart from 9-1-1 calls.
- This is an average of more than 327 non-emergency calls per day
- In 2024, the average time spent on a 9-1-1 call was 84.9 seconds.





# Homeguard

- Members of the Auxiliary Unit attend and conduct a home security audit. They inspect windows, doors, and the exterior of the home. A written report is provided to the homeowner detailing potential improvements, for maximum safety.
- This allows community members to take an active role in making their homes less susceptible to criminal activity. professional

- Members of the Auxiliary Unit attend and conduct a business security audit. A written report is provided to the business owner detailing potential improvements, for maximum safety.
- This allows local business owners to take an active role in making their businesses less susceptible to criminal activity.



# **CAMSafe**



- CAMSafe is a volunteer registry of CCTV, video cameras and doorbell cams in the City of Peterborough, Village of Lakefield, and Township of Cavan-Monaghan.
- It allows officers to know much like a phonebook – the location of video cameras in and around a community and then who to contact to get any footage.




- Balancing the needs and expectations of all residents in our community.
- There is a need for a compassionate response for those suffering with addictions and we expect officers to be kind in their engagements with individuals.
- The Service also knows that the community expects that public places such as parks, places of business, and most importantly places where our children go such as playgrounds should also be safe.
- If officers see open air illicit drug use or if/when we receive a call for service from a concerned resident we will attend and direct that person to stop and move to a different location.
